

# **Brief Program Descriptions**

Aetna Hose Hook and Ladder of Newark, DE	The Aetna HHL program allows six interns to complete their EMT training with Aetna's field training officers. The interns are given the tools and support to gain applicable experience and are offered a part-time position upon completion of the program.
Black Mothers In Power	To help reduce the racial disparities that Black women face during childbirth, Black Mothers In Power are expanding their community-based doula program, which seeks to improve outcomes through Doula training and advocacy, as well as address depression, child-parent bonds, self-esteem, and breastfeeding outcomes.
Central Delaware Housing Collaborative	Thanks to House of Hope, homeless women in the state of Delaware have the resources to obtain physical and mental health care despite lack of insurance. They are provided with a nurse practitioner within walking distance and transportation to and from appointments can be arranged for all their clients.
Delaware Pharmaceutical Society	The Medication Therapy Management program run by the Delaware Pharmaceutical Society aims to improve the health of patients in Kent and Sussex Counties by increasing the number of pharmacists in underserved communities, improving patient education and medication adherence, and providing preventive screenings and immunizations.

Ingleside Homes, Inc	Ingleside Homes provides supplemental financial support to low-moderate-income seniors in Delaware through their Health Equity Fund. Since 2020, that number has climbed from 23 per year to 49 individuals who need assistance, at an average rate of \$317.29 per resident per month.
Mental Health Association in Delaware	Mental Health Association is increasing the number of behavioral health practitioners and support resources in Delaware. They provide wellness groups for those in recovery, training for peers and other healthcare professionals, and coordinating internships for peers to become Certified Peer Specialists.
St. John's Community Services	To increase access to quality healthcare for people with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD), SJCS will purchase a StationMD subscription to provide specialized telehealth. StationMD doctors are specially trained to address this population's complex health needs and able to treat patients through their simple telemedicine platform.
Strive: How You Lead Matters	Sports Challenge 2023 is designed to support rising 9th-12th grade basketball and soccer players in Delaware as they develop skills for success in sport and life. The program runs for five days and takes participants through high energy workouts, practices and leadership workshops covering Strive's seven core competencies: self-awareness, empathy, grit, communication, motivation, energy, and culture creation.
Sussex Economic Development Action Committee	In this first phase project, SEDAC will commission a feasibility study to support decision making on establishing an osteopathic medical school in Sussex County. The study will assess physician workforce needs; how the school could work with DIMER, other state programs, and the three county Hospital systems; and will provide guidance for the best academic, economic, and operational models.
The Rosa Health Center	The Rosa Health Center has grown to serve over 1900 low income, birth to geriatric patients of Sussex County and the surrounding area. The enlargement of the facility is critical for the center because with only two exam rooms, they have a growing list of patients needing healthcare. This will also lead to better health outcomes and reduced disparities.
Unite for HER	Through Project Lift, Unite for HER is working to develop an integrative services program to Delaware residents with a focus on underrepresented populations with breast and ovarian cancer at no cost to the patient. Their vision is that every person with breast and

ovarian cancers will feel the support of a loving community, and will have access to comprehensive education, integrative care, services, and tools that enrich their health.
